The MLitt Environment, Culture & Communication is concerned with the relationships we hold with our 'wild' environments, and how these evolved.

You will develop a knowledge of environmental debates from both cultural and scientific perspectives, and learn to communicate environmental issues using a variety of tools. There is a choice of project work: you can choose to engage with a particular contemporary environmental issue or case study, OR to undertake a personal interaction with the features of a particular location, examining notions of place creatively. The programme is 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time.
