PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The purpose of this program is to prepare students from disadvantaged backgrounds to be competitive applicants for graduate or professional school. The core experience for program participants will be a test preparation course for the GRE, DAT, or MCAT examinations. In addition to strengthening test taking skills, participants will engage in different workshops designed to support them through the admissions process for graduate or professional school. *The program will be free of charge for accepted participants.*

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- Kaplan test prep course for GRE,MCAT or DAT
- One-on-one tutoring
- Peer educator support
- Workshops:
 - Interview techniques
 - Writing personal statements
 - Applying for financial aid and scholarships

ELIGIBILITY:

- Undergraduate and graduate students interested in pursuing careers in the health sciences.
- Applicant must have completed their second year of undergraduate coursework or beyond.
- To be competitive, applicant should have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 and science GPA of 2.5.
- Applicant must self-identify as coming from an economically and educationally disadvantaged background.
- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident; documentation may be requested.
