**Subject Tutors:** A subject tutor is responsible for breaking down concepts of a particular course to a student-athlete. The tutor is not required to have taken the course specifically, but the tutor must be knowledgeable on the subject matter. Subject tutors typically meet for weekly, recurring sessions so a consistent schedule is preferable. Tutors are able to tutor as many subjects as they feel comfortable tutoring.
